## HIPAA Is Coming

You may have heard about the new HIPAA privacy, security, and data transmission regulations. These HIPAA regulations are the outcome of federal legislation that seeks to increase the privacy of electronically stored medical information and to simplify the various data formats used for electronic claims submission. The regulations are effective as of April 14, 2001, and require compliance within the next two years.

While it will be some time until the necessary programming changes implied by these regulations are clarified, Medical Applications anticipates that the required changes will be completed in advance of the final deadline.

For example, the most recent EDI submitter newsletter from Medicare/NHIC states that electronic claims must be submitted in the HIPAA-required ANSI format by October 2002. Avanta electronic claims have been submitted in the ANSI format since 1995.
