Halloween's origins date back to the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain (pronounced sow-in). The Celts, celebrated their new year on November 1, and believed that on the night before the new year, the boundary between the worlds of the living and the dead became blurred. So, on the night of October 31 they celebrated Samhain, and during the celebration the Celts wore costumes, typically consisting of animal heads and skins, and attempted to tell each other's fortunes.

The American tradition of "trick-or-treating" probably dates back to the early All Souls' Day parades in England. During the festivities, poor citizens would beg for food and families would give them pastries called "soul cakes" in return for their promise to pray for the family's dead relatives.
