



From the October 8. 2004 NHIC bulletin:

"Effective October 1, 2004, Medicare no longer provides a 90-day grace period for the use of discontinued ICD-9-CM diagnosis codes. Physicians, practitioners, and suppliers must bill using the updated codes."

Avanta users can easily check for codes that are no longer recognized (or "obsolete") by running "Check For Obsolete ICD-9 Codes" under the Diagnoses section of Edit Practice Files (From the Home Screen, 8, 4, 5). This feature compares your diagnoses file with the ICD-9 book that is loaded into your system each year and stamps the diagnoses that are in your file as "Obsolete". When a diagnosis is marked as obsolete, it cannot be used (posted) again until you manually remove the obsolete condition. If diagnoses are marked as obsolete, they do remain in the patient's ledger for historical purposes.
